




Recent Advocacy Successes Increased funding for the National Institutes of Health, National Institute of Neurological Disorders and Stroke, BRAIN Initiative, and Alzheimer's-specific research Repeal of the flawed SGR formula Replaced by MACRA Sustained funding for the VA's Epilepsy Centers of Excellence
