Derek Brandt, JD, is director of Congressional Affairs for the American Academy of Neurology. During more than 10 years in government relations, Brandt successfully lobbied to reform physician payments in Medicare, including passing into law a significant expansion of reimbursements for telestroke consultations. He also secured billions of dollars in federal funding for neuroscience research, and helped grow the AAN's political action to

become top-ten medical specialty PAC.

American Academy of Neurology: Combatting regulatory burdens

Physicians, including neurologists, face growing administrative requirements from the federal government, insurers, and their institutions. Despite the medical community constantly working towards providing more efficient high-quality patient care, they are forced to adhere to many redundant and ineffective processes. Neurologists need relief from overwhelming regulatory requirements that do not add value, so they may prioritize caring for patients with complex diseases of the brain and nervous system.

The AAN supports:

- Policies to alleviate burden associated with prior authorization, step therapy, quality reporting, and other administrative tasks
- The Safe Step Act (H.R. 2279) which establishes commonsense exceptions to step therapy in group health plans

Marissa N. Dean, MD, is an instructor-fellow in the Division of Movement Disorders in the Department of Neurology at UAB.

She completed medical school at Wayne State University School of Medicine in Detroit, Mich. For internship, she completed a preliminary internal medicine year at St. Johns Hospital and

Medical Center in Detroit.

She returned to Detroit Medical Center/Wayne State University for residency and served as a chief neurology resident in her final year. She has a special interest in the clinical genetics of movement disorders.



R. Edward Faught Jr., MD, is a professor in the Department of Neurology at Emory University School of Medicine and is director of the Emory Epilepsy Center.

He attended medical school at Columbia University and Vanderbilt University. His post graduate training was completed at the

University of Virginia.

From 1980 to 2009, Dr. Faught was a full-time faculty member of the University of Alabama - Birmingham where he founded and directed the UAB Epilepsy Center. Dr. Faught is a Colonel in the U.S. Army Reserve and a former Commander of an U.S. Army hospital.

He has published more than 300 scientific articles and book chapters. His research interests are clinical trials of new antiepileptic drugs and epidemiology of epilepsy.



Toby I. Gropen, MD, FAHA, is the James H. Halsey Jr., MD, Professor of Neurology, chief of the Division of Cerebrovascular Disease and the director of the Comprehensive Neurovascular and Stroke Center at UAB.

He previously served as the director of Vascular Neurology at Ochsner Medical Center

in New Orleans and the chairman of Neurology and director of the Stroke Center at Long Island College Hospital in Brooklyn, NY.

Dr. Gropen earned his medical degree from University of Texas Health Science Center in San Antonio. His postgraduate training included a medical internship at Bronx Municipal Hospital Center, in affiliation with Albert Einstein College of Medicine, and a neurology residency and clinical fellowship in stroke and cerebral blood flow at Columbia Presbyterian Medical Center's Neurological Institute.



Zeenat Jaisani, MD, is assistant professor in the Department of Neurology at UAB.

She graduated from Mahatma Gandhi Memorial Medical College Indore in 2001 and completed her residency at Jacobs Neurological Institute, SUNY at Buffalo in 2011.

She currently practices at UAB Epilepsy Center and is affiliated with UAB Hospital.



Stephen R. Shows, JD, is a Senior Risk Resource Advisor for ProAssurance, providing risk management advice to physicians and other healthcare providers regarding medical malpractice issues. As a licensed attorney, Shows has practiced for many years in litigation, always for the defense. He also served as an assistant

attorney general for the State of Alabama.

Victor Sung, MD, is associate professor in the Department of Neurology, Division of Movement Disorders at UAB. Student Neuroscience Course.

Dr. Sung received his medical degree from UT-Southwestern in Dallas and completed his general intern year at John Peter Smith Hospital in Fort Worth, Texas, where he was named Outstanding Overall Intern. He completed residency training in neurology at UAB in 2009.



Jerzy P. Szaflarski, MD, PhD, is a professor in the Department of Neurology at UAB and serves as director of the Division of Epilepsy. He also directs the Level IV UAB Epilepsy Center.

Dr. Szaflarski received his MD and PhD from Collegium Medicum of the Nicolaus Copernicus University in Torun, Poland. He then completed

a neurology residency and later a fellowship in clinical neurophysiology and epilepsy at University of Cincinnati, Ohio.

Dr. Szaflarski initiated his research career with a fellowship at the Medical College of Wisconsin in the laboratory of Dr. Jeffrey R. Binder, where he studied functional magnetic resonance imaging (MRI) acquisition and analysis.


